Pigeon Wi-Fi

Toruń Launches Pigeon-Powered Wi-Fi Pilot Scheme in Old Town

TORUŃ – In a move that has surprised both residents and tech analysts, city officials in Toruń have approved a small-scale pilot program aimed at enhancing Wi-Fi coverage in the Old Town by using the city’s abundant pigeon population.

The initiative, developed in partnership with the Nicolaus Copernicus University’s Department of Wireless Innovation, involves attaching lightweight micro signal amplifiers—roughly the size of a paperclip—to select homing pigeons. These devices do not emit signals themselves but instead amplify and redistribute existing Wi-Fi, particularly in high-footfall tourist areas.

A city spokesperson described the project as a “cost-effective alternative to satellite-based infrastructure”, citing the high density of pigeons in Toruń’s historic center as an advantage.

“The idea is to enhance signal strength in areas where traditional boosters can’t be easily installed due to heritage preservation restrictions,” said the spokesperson. “Pigeons naturally occupy high vantage points and move through key areas, making them ideal carriers.”

Public reaction has been mixed. One local café owner called the idea “creative but kind of mad,” while another resident posted on social media, “If my internet drops every time the birds fly off, I’m going back to books.”

However, experts involved in the project insist the science is sound.

Dr. Ernest Lewandowski, who leads the research team, explained:

“These micro-devices latch onto ambient signals and gently boost them across short distances. It’s not as powerful as a satellite system, but it’s much cheaper—and, in urban environments like Toruń, surprisingly efficient.”

While skeptics remain, early trials are already underway, with results expected by summer.

If successful, officials say the program could expand to other Polish cities by 2026.

Gold is King



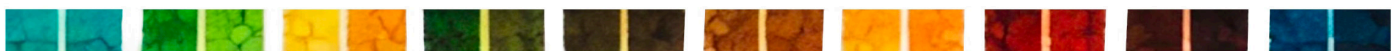
As of March 29, 2025, gold prices have reached record highs, trading at approximately \$3,085.78 per ounce.

Slavery Payouts

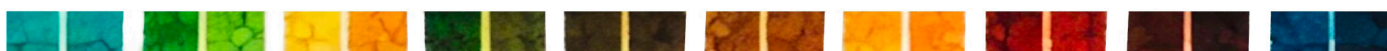
Labour Opens Talks on Slavery Payouts – The Economy Breathes a Sigh of Despair

What Happens Next?

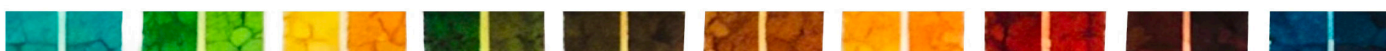
With no clear plan, no final sum, and no agreement on who actually gets what, Labour is moving forward with the classic British approach:

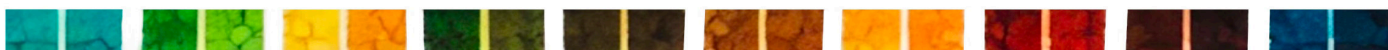


Rachel Reeves Secures Economic Strategy: Free VIP Concert Tickets for All... Well, Just Her Daughter

system.”

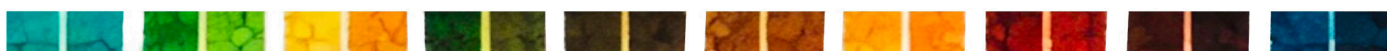

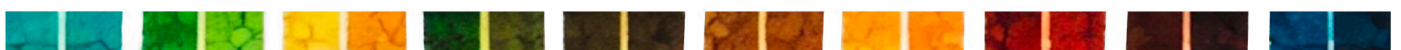

scraps at Westminster than pleading for support at the JobCentre?

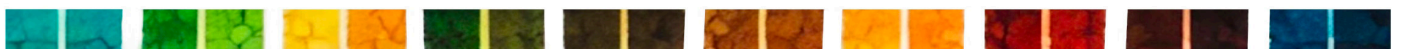
